- for health

An un-neutered female rabbit will almost certainly develop uterine cancer by the age of 5 - less than half a normal life span. Many symptoms do not show until it is too late and your rabbit will suffer terribly. Male rabbits are also susceptible to cancers.

- for companionship

Rabbits are social animals and should be given a life with a friend or friends. The most common pairing is male and female, so of course neutering will stop unwanted babies. Both rabbits must be neutered as an entire male will mount the female constantly which will upset her.

- for behaviour

Un-neutered rabbits display sexual behaviour which at best is not pleasant and at worst dangerous. Hormonal rabbits will mount incessantly, spray urine and be destructive and VERY territorial. Territorial behaviour includes aggression such as boxing, biting, scratching and charging. Rabbits have sharp claws and teeth, this behaviour can cause serious injury.
